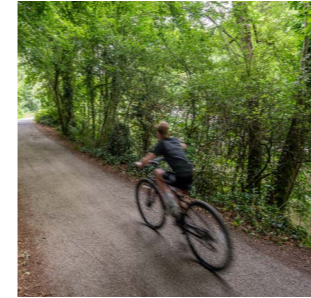


# About the Chief Executive's Report

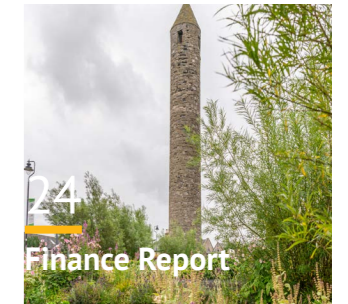

### Templeogue Village

Work on improvements to Templeogue Village began at the start of the summer and include the opening of a new car park on Council owned lands to the rear of the village. This new car park will allow the existing car park on Riverside Way to be redeveloped for much needed new homes. On the main street, the scheme comprises traffic calming measures, as well as new street trees, benches and bike stands.

## City Edge Project Public Consultation

As part of a national strategy to regenerate and rejuvenate our cities and large towns while concentrating new housing and employment in existing urban areas, South Dublin County Council (SDCC) and Dublin City Council (DCC) have come together in a collaborative partnership and joint urban regeneration effort known as the City Edge Project.

As part of the work completed on this project to date, we have developed a comprehensive understanding of what is in this area today, as well as the opportunities and constraints. Informed by this we believe there is a sizeable opportunity

to both support existing industry but also to reshape this important area and introduce opportunities for new homes and jobs. To help shape this framework plan, we will be running a non-statutory four week public consultation programme from 9 September 2021 to midnight 6 October 2021.

Display information and details on how to access live online events will be available to view in a Virtual Consultation Room and submissions will be invited via SDCC's Online Consultation Portal. Submissions will be the subject of a report to the Elected Members of SDCC and DCC, which will inform the project before it progresses to a more detailed framework plan.

# Housing, Social and Community Development



## Mobile Home Loan Scheme

South Dublin County Council is one of four local authorities who, in conjunction with the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage, are piloting a new Caravan/Mobile Home Loans Scheme. In total €1 million has been made available under the pilot scheme with €300k provisionally allocated to this Council.

A maximum loan of €30k is available to eligible applicants and information was circulated to all residents of Traveller halting site bays. Following its launch in July 2021, over 30 expressions of interest have already been received ahead of the closing date of 10 September 2021, after which applications will be assessed and loans issued.



## Housing Online

As part of the ongoing roll-out of our new integrated housing system, tenants will be asked to register for the Council's new housing online (HOL) portal in the coming weeks. HOL will allow tenants to manage their tenancy online 24/7 from any device without having to wait to contact our customer service team during normal office hours. We will contact all Council tenants in phases with details on how to register.

## Successful Sports Partnership Disability Summer Camps

Several inspiring and focused sports inclusion focused camps were delivered across the County by our dedicated sports team aimed at children and teens with autism spectrum disorders and/or intellectual disabilities this summer.

These camps were designed to support inclusion by young people in various sporting activities and were delivered in partnership with Basketball Ireland, Wheelchair Basketball, the Football Association of Ireland, Dublin Lions Boxing Club, Leinster Rugby and Clondalkin Rugby Football Club.

Hundreds of children attended

camps at various locations over the summer with really positive parent and participant feedback. We will continue to explore further opportunities for such camps in future. Sports inclusion and increasing participation opportunities for all young people is a key focus of the work of the sports team and we are happy to work with support groups and any sports clubs interested in partnering on future programmes.

## Shopfront Improvement Grant Scheme

LIA - Life Insurance Association Ireland - a professional educational and development association for the financial services industry, has been awarded €1,000 in recognition of the work undertaken to transform the shopfront design of its business premises. LIA of Kimmage Road West, Dublin 12 received €1,000 from South Dublin County Council under the Council's annual Shopfront Improvement Grant Scheme. The award of Best Designed Shopfront was in addition to a grant received to part-fund the installation of an improved shopfront design.

The Shopfront Grant Scheme provides an opportunity for local businesses and retailers to preserve

and enhance our villages. Winning the Best Designed Shopfront award as well as receiving the grant towards the improvement works shows that it makes sense for local businesses to apply for the Shopfront Improvement Grant Scheme. A building's facade can make a big impact on the streetscape and how a shopfront looks matters to both the business owner and the local community.

The annual Shopfront Improvement Grant Scheme provides grants for something as simple as painting, to replacing an entire shop front. Grants are available for a maximum of 50% of overall costs. Furthermore, a prize of €1,000 is awarded for the Best Designed Shopfront under the scheme.

The Tallaght Central area has been patiently waiting for the launch of the €300k Have Your Say initiative, which has been postponed since it was drawn from a hat at a Council meeting in February 2020. We are delighted to announce that €300k Have Your Say will now be launched for the Tallaght Central area on Wednesday 8 September. The submissions phase of the initiative will also open following the launch and remain open until Friday 8 October.

€300k Have Your Say is a participatory budgeting initiative that has been run by South Dublin County Council since 2017. The initiative allows residents to develop and

submit ideas for their local area. They then vote on the shortlisted ideas to identify the best winning projects that will be funded up to the value of €300,000. There are no age barriers to taking part and every proposal is welcome and treated with respect.

# Environment, Water Climate Change



## Positive response to DURL

The EU funded DURL Project continues to make positive progress across all its actions, including calling to selected private houses to find domestic misconnections in the River Griffeen (SDCC) and Carrickmines (DLRCC) catchment areas. The Project has received an overwhelmingly positive response from householders, and residents associations, as the stormwater assessors have called to 1,200 houses since May 2021 and assessed the stormwater (rainwater) drainage at 99% of the houses contacted.

The DURL Stormwater Assessors will continue to work with householders to ensure pollution is no longer entering our water-courses and of the 120 misconnections identified to date 52% have already been repaired, and householders have committed to repairing the outstanding misconnections. This phenomenal support and co-operation from householders will significantly improve the local water quality and benefit biodiversity.



## Clean Air Together Project

Clean Air Together invites members of the public to measure Dublin's air quality. It is a citizen science project where 1,000 participants will record levels of Nitrogen Dioxide (NO2) pollution in their local area. It is a joint project between the EPA and An Taisce that aims to improve air quality in Dublin in the future. ## Teenspace Programme delivers facilities at Collinstown Park

The Council's Teenspace programme is underway with ongoing consultation with teenagers in local areas and the delivery facilities within South Dublin County's public spaces.

The Teenspace programme is designed to provide teenagers with their own space within public spaces: well located in a high profile location, safe, well designed and pleasant; this space will support teenagers to meet with their peers, engage in unstructured activity and feel safe.

To date, the Council has delivered Teenspaces in Collinstown Park,

Tandy's Lane Park and with the recent calisthenics area opened at Tymon Park. A Teenspace is currently under construction at Ballycragh Park and consultation is underway at a number of other locations.

The Collinstown Park Teenspace opened to the public in July and is adjacent to the very popular playspace. It contains seating areas, a bicycle track, a basketball area and goal for informal games, Teqball and a calisthenics (keep fit) area. It will be augmented within the coming weeks with the addition of a parkour area.

# Sod Turned on Flagship Reservoir Project



**Irish Water in partnership with Dublin City Council and South Dublin County Council marked the start of the works on building a new reservoir in Saggart.**

The strategically important reservoir project in Saggart involves the construction of a new 100 million litre covered treated storage reservoir that will help to safeguard the water supply to homes and businesses in the Greater Dublin Area (GDA). The new state of the art reservoir will store 100 million litres of treated drinking water, the equivalent of 40 Olympic sized swimming pools supplied from Ballymore Eus-

tace Water treatment plant, Ireland's largest water treatment plant.

The construction of the new reservoir and associate pipelines is expected to be completed within three years. Coffey Construction Ireland Limited recently signed the contract to deliver this project on behalf of Irish Water.

The upgrade marks the first significant investment in the existing

## Why build a new reservoir?

Today across the world and in Ireland we can see the impacts of climate change bringing long spells of warmer weather and warnings alongside the continued need to support housing, businesses and economic growth. The Eastern side of the country and the Greater Dublin Area's water network need to be more resilient to periods of high demand and we need to build future capacity into water system for all.

This project is one of a number of critical steps in safeguarding Dublin's water supply to ensure it is capable of meeting current and future demand.

Saggart waterworks since it was built in the 1950's. The current waterworks will be replaced with a new reservoir that will provide treated drinking water storage, building resilience in the water infrastructure for the GDA and improving the security of supply for existing and future residential and commercial development.

Speaking at the sod turning for the Saggart reservoir project, Mayor of South Dublin County Council, Cllr Peter Kavanagh said, "The construction of this key piece of infrastructure demonstrates how Irish Water, working in partnership with South Dublin County Council and Dublin City Council and along with Coffey Construction is delivering infrastructure that is critical for our communities and our economy."

The delivery of this project will support existing and future residential and commercial development in the Greater Dublin Area and I would like to wish Irish Water and the project team well as they embark on this important project that will help to build resilience in our water infrastructure for the longer term."

# Opening of Tandy's Lane Park



**The Tandy's Lane Park project has delivered a large-scale public park within Adamstown for the use of residents and visitors.**

**T**andy's Lane Park has been designed to a high contemporary standard and quality that will enhance the identity of Adamstown and has been designed for all, from young to old, with a range of recreational opportunities that will invite users back for repeat visits.

The €5 million Tandy's Lane Park construction project, which received funding from the Department of

Housing, Local Government and Heritage's Local Infrastructure Housing Activation Fund, commenced in 2019 and is due for completion in October 2021. As several portions of the park were substantially complete, the Council decided to open these sections to support an Outdoor Summer in the Lucan area in 2021.

The park will provide formal and informal recreation facilities, such as

## Infrastructure Projects for Adamstown

A combined €15 million was allocated for the three projects by the then Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government through the Local Infrastructure Housing Activation Funds (LIHAF) with South Dublin County Council providing the extra €5 million in funding for three significant infrastructure projects at the Adamstown Strategic Development Zone (SDZ).

The ambitious large-scale delivery of essential infrastructure in Adamstown consists of the construction of three separate projects: Airlie Park, Tandy's Lane Park and the Celbridge Link Road. The Council's successful LIHAF funding bid for financial support was linked to the delivery of 2,000 new homes within the Adamstown SDZ.

playing pitches, three interconnected playgrounds, and a fitness area alongside high quality soft and hard landscaping. The soft landscapes including the provision of wildflower meadows will provide a leisurely setting whilst also providing a pollinator-friendly environment.

The areas of Tandy's Lane Park that have been recently opened include extensive areas of footpaths with informal seating, surrounded by flower meadows and allowing views of the retained, mature hedgerows and woodland areas. The new park also includes newly planted areas with native and ornamental trees, including a newly planted orchard area. The larger of the playspaces is also open, with an adjacent picnic area and, further into the park, a parkour / teenage

area is also available.

The phased opening of the park has been much welcomed locally with the playground and teenage areas getting plenty of use and providing hours of enjoyment for visitors to this new park. The remainder of the park will open later this year once the works are fully completed.

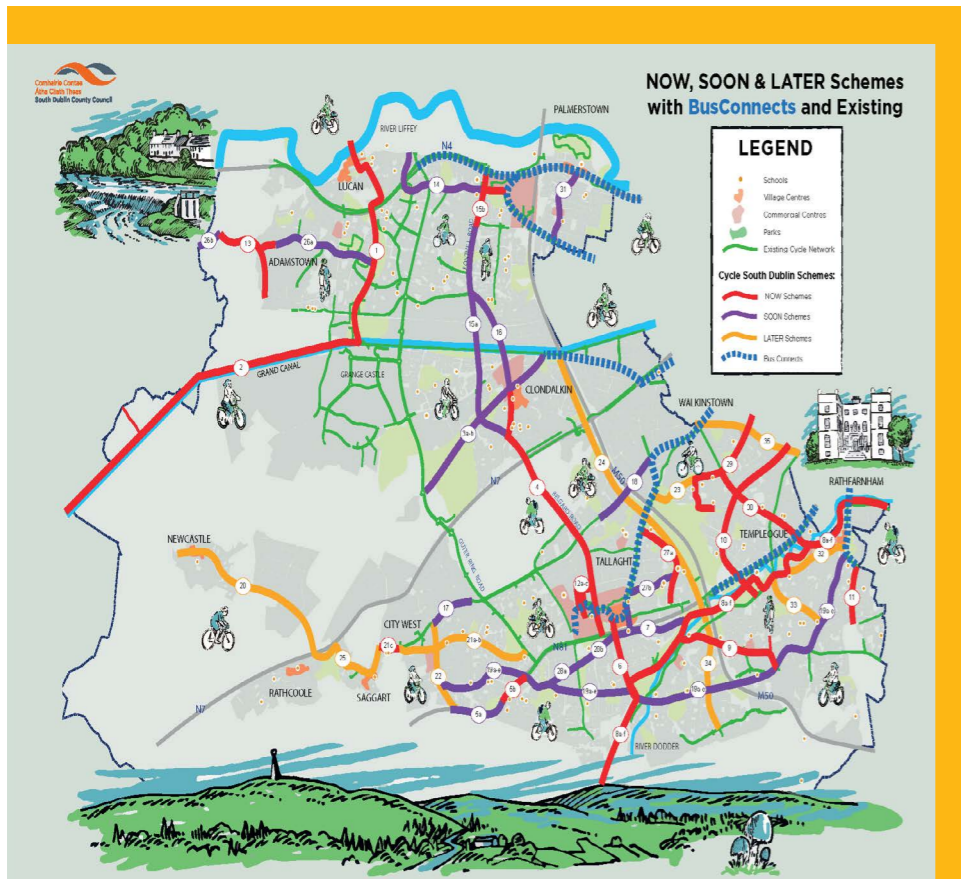

South Dublin County Council has joined together with the other three Dublin local authorities, Codema - Dublin's Energy Agency, and the Dublin Climate Action Regional Office to organise the first ever Dublin Climate Action Week which will take place from 13 to 19 September 2021.

During the week, a huge range of online and in-person events will demonstrate the local authorities' efforts, ambitions, and collaborative approach we are taking in addressing climate change. These include a panel discussion on tackling Climate Change in South Dublin County, a solar powered cinema screening of the climate film 2040 in Rathfarnham Castle Park, a free online workshop that will explain

how Sustainable Energy Communities can help South Dublin County citizens identify sustainable energy solutions in our homes, schools, businesses and communities and much more.

**Innovative Projects**

Dublin Climate Action Week is only one example of how South Dublin County Council is responding to climate change and delivering on targets set out in our Climate Change Action Plan. Projects such as the Tallaght District Heating Scheme and the LED street lighting programme demonstrate how we are committed to taking significant action to tackle climate change.

Particularly in the area of active travel, the Council has adopted an ambitious programme of work in Cycle South Dublin that reflects the increasing importance of making cycling a realistic and integral part of how people move around the County. It proposes a set of 57 projects that

will bring significant interconnectivity for pedestrians and cyclists across South Dublin County now and over the next eight years. This will enable the communities of South Dublin County to make realistic choices to walk or cycle to school/work and for leisure on a more regular basis. One of the many benefits of this will result in a significant contribution towards our climate and reducing our lifestyle carbon emissions.

Active travel is considered the most sustainable and low carbon form of getting from A to B. Increased use of active travel which will happen as we roll out more routes and increase interconnectivity for South Dublin County, will have massive lifecycle carbon emissions benefits.

Our plans for improved active travel in South Dublin County are committed to enabling communities to connect with the parks, woodlands, waterways and roads through active travel modes of transport. This helps develop pro-environment behaviours which include improved travel choices, energy use and waste. Making active travel options such as walking and cycling fun and accessible and empowering people to reduce their carbon footprint, generating cleaner air for all is at the forefront of what we aim to deliver to improve our environment through active travel.

We will continue to focus on the delivery of all active travel projects and in engaging citizens within our communities to take up walking and cycling as part of their daily lives. With some big projects, such as the Dodder Greenway, Lucan Canal Loop, Citywest to Rathfarnham, Grand Canal extension on the way, to name but a few, we will have every area covered in South Dublin County for realistic options on active travel.

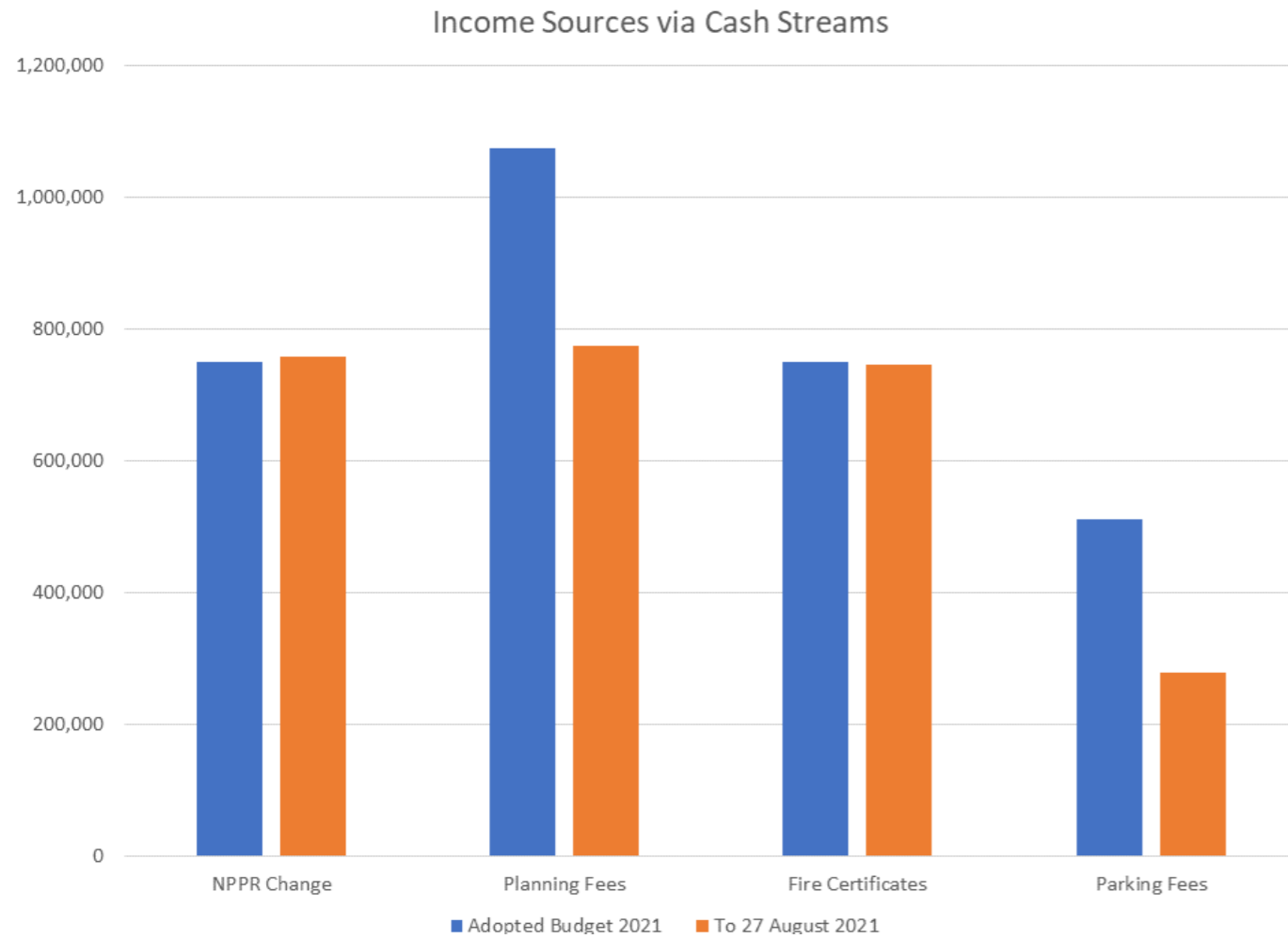
