Eco-Unesco biodiversity workshop aims to raise awareness amongst young people about the importance of, and provide practical options for, promoting biodiversity. It specifically aims to enable young people to develop an understanding of biodiversity, to explore the concept of interconnectedness in the natural world and to explore the positive and negative effects of human activity on the



natural environment. This workshop will empower young people to act in a more environmentally responsible manner and help them to carry out an action to promote biodiversity in their locality using creative recycling (e.g. construct bird-feeders, plant native plant species from recycled materials). SOUTH DUBLIN COUNTY COUNCIL ENERGY PROJECT EXHIBITION

South Dublin County Council is committed to reducing its energy use and carbon dioxide emissions. The Council has a proven track record in the area of renewable technologies. Since 2005 it has developed a number of pilot projects through the new build capital works programme which test technologies such as CHP, solar thermal, photovoltaic cells and geo thermal. As part of Eco Week we are holding an exhibition of these and our refurbishment projects.

In addition we have recently launched our Draft Sustainable Energy Action Plan (SEAP) which was developed as a result of our links with the EU leadership in energy action planning (LEAP) project. The SEAP promotes 3 guiding principles – record, reduce, replace. We have measured and recorded our energy use and we will continue to reduce our energy use through improved efficiencies, building upgrades and replacing fossil fuel using technologies with more sustainable renewable and reduced carbon technologies.










SOUTH DUBLIN SUSTAINABLE ENERGY ACTION PLAN (SEAP)



On Thursday 21st February 2013, SDCC launched on public display the Draft South Dublin Sustainable Energy Action Plan (SEAP). The Draft Sustainable Energy Action Plan sets out how South Dublin County can take the lead in addressing EU and national energy reduction targets to 2020. The SEAP has been undertaken in partnership with the Town and Country Planning Association (TCPA) and eight other local authorities across the EU, as part of the Leadership for Energy Action and Planning (LEAP) programme. The South Dublin SEAP has also been prepared with input from the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland

(SEAI) and City of Dublin Energy Management Agency (CODEMA). The South Dublin SEAP analyses the County's energy consumption and carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions and sets out how South Dublin County can reduce consumption and CO2 emissions, in line with 2020 energy targets, through a range of energy actions. SEAP actions aim to make South Dublin an energy efficient, low carbon County, by focusing on improved recording and analysis of energy data, improved efficiency in buildings, facilities and operations across all sectors, energy reduction in the transport sector, and increasing the level of energy generated from renewable sources.
