AN EUNING WITH DEGLIN SHATEVAND STERIEN MOONEY

Declan Shalvey and Stephen Mooney are two of the most prolific and successful Irish comic creators currently working.

Declan has worked extensively for major American publishers such as Marvel, DC, Image and Dark Horse drawing titles such as Moon Knight, Thunderbolts and much more. He has also written two crime graphic novels set in Ireland, Savage Town, illustrated by Philip Barrett, and Bog Bodies, illustrated by Gavin Fullerton, both published by Image Comics.

Stephen's work is mainly published by IDW publishing in the USA. He's drawn several mini-series based on well known TV properties such as CSI: Crime Scene Investigation, Angel, Spike and The A-Team, and cinema's The Mummy. Most recently he's been working on his creator owned pulp adventure series 'Half Past Danger', set in an alternative history World War II.
