CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S MESSAGE

The 2023 Red Line Book Festival, which runs from 16th to 22nd October, again sees our Libraries and Arts teams showcasing the best of South Dublin County. With over 35 events, featuring many special guests, in fantastic venues including The Civic, Tallaght Stadium, Rathfarnham Castle, Pearse Museum, and Brú Chrónáin Round Tower Visitor Centre Clondalkin, Red Line promotes a variety of local cultural and historical offerings.

This year's festival programme includes a special conference on the Decade of Centenaries, hosted by historian, author and presenter Turtle Bunbury. This will include a talk from David McCullagh on Éamon de Valera's 1923 while historian Liz Gillis will share "The Story of Noel Lemass: His Life and Death" and she'll also be in conversation with Niall Quinn about the story of footballer, rebel and politician, Oscar Traynor. Flor McCarthy will tell the deeply personal story of her family's links on both sides of the War of Independence and Caitriona Crowe will round off the conference with "The Decade of Centenaries: a retrospect".

Literary and theatrical events feature heavily throughout the festival with selected highlights including John Banville discussing his life and work with author Dermot Bolger, *Aisling Ever After* authors Emer McLysaght and Sarah Breen chatting with Muireann O'Connell about their best-selling series, true crime podcaster and journalist Nicola Tallant exploring some of Ireland's unsolved murders with authors Nick Foster, Sharon Lawless and Maresa Fagan.

Also included are a range of events and shows such as "Roald Dahl and the Imagination Seekers", a family fun day at the Cultural Quarter in Tallaght, writing workshops, and "The Art of Collaboration", which will close this year's festival.

There really is something for everyone in the diverse programme of events and we invite from residents from South Dublin and beyond to join us and enjoy this year's Red Line Book Festival.

In partnership with NOISE Music, the Red Line Book Festival Writer in Residence for 2023 is The Queenship Cypher collective, led by Alayex, a ground-breaking female-led creative agency. As part of their residency, The Queenship Cypher are leading a five-week development programme of workshops which aim to start a revolution in the Irish music industry, creating a sisterhood of creative women and empowering female artists through career expansion, talent showcasing, and artistic development. The Queenship Cypher issued an open invitation for all female creatives aged 18-25 to express interest in being part of the programme.

This revolutionary platform serves as a stepping stone for those seeking to turn their musical, movement and visual expressions into a fulfilling career, while forming connections with audiences and fellow female creatives. The Queenship Cypher emerges as the much-needed representation and collaboration for female rap artists in Ireland.

The programme is curated in four complimentary streams, each led by industry experts:

•Songwriting: Guided by Alicia Raye, an acclaimed artist and music mentor, the songwriting workshop will delve into the heart of lyrical storytelling.

•Music Production: Led by NOISE Music mentors, the music production program will help artists to master the art of music production and create inspiring sounds.

• Set Design: Ella Bertilsson, a resident artist at Rua Red, will help artists to elevate their stage presence with mesmerising visual experiences.

•Dance: Under the guidance of Vithoria Escobar, from UMAKOKO Productions, artists will explore the language of movement and how to use it to complement music.

DECADE OF CENTENARIES SEMINAR

South Dublin County Council's Decade of Centenaries Programme has explored the impact of the pivotal events of 100 years ago at both a national and local level, through cultural events, historical reflections, artistic interpretations, lectures and exhibitions.

We also reflected on life at the time in a broader context, including the social conditions experienced by local people during the revolutionary period, cultural life, the role of women, and the experiences of children during this time.

In this, the final year of the Decade of Centenaries, we are delighted to present this seminar with leading historians of the period, looking at some of the key events and personalities of 1923, as well as looking back on the Decade of Centenaries.

Historian and Podcaster Turtle Bunbury will host seminar sessions as follows:

J. F. Murray is an Irish writer from Co. Meath, Ireland. When the 2020 pandemic hit, Murray used the lockdown as an opportunity to pursue storytelling full-time, and began writing his debut novel *Fling*. He is a proud member of the LGBTQ+ community and has gained a following on TikTok with a unique brand of Irish comedy sketches.

Bryan Moriarty was born in Dublin and studied at Trinity College Dublin before moving to London to train as an actor at LAMDA. In addition to performing in theatre, film, and TV, he has written and produced several short films, plays and a web series. His first novel, Sounds Like Fun, was selected for the Irish Writers Centre Novel Fair 2021.

Born and raised in the island town of Enniskillen in Northern Ireland, Ryan Love is a NCTJ-qualified journalist. He was the first Showbiz Editor at Digital Spy and has written for publications including the Independent, the Telegraph, Attitude, Radio Times and Yahoo. Ryan's debut novel, *Arthur and Teddy Are Coming Out*, was published by HarperCollins in April 2023.

John Banville is one of the greats of Irish Literature. Join John as he speaks to host and author Dermot Bolger about his life and work.

John Banville is a novelist, screenwriter, playwright and book reviewer. He worked in journalism for many years, and was literary editor at The Irish Times from 1988 to 2000. He is a regular contributor to The New York Review of Books, and other journals. His novels include *The Book of Evidence, The Sea*, and, most recently, *The Singularities*. Among the awards he has received are the Man Booker Prize, the Austrian State Prize for Literature, the Kafka Prize, Irish PEN Award and the Prince of Asturias Award. He has written a number of crime novels, including *Snow*, and, most recently, *The Lock-Up*. He was born in Wexford, and lives in Dublin.

Dermot Bolger is a poet, novelist and playwright. His fourteen novels include *The Journey Home, The Family* on Paradise Pier, An Ark of Light and, most recently, *The Lonely Sea and Sky and A Second Life*, both published in new editions in 2022. His debut play, *The Lament for Arthur Cleary*, received The Samuel Beckett Award.

Other plays include an adaptation of Joyce's Ulysses and Last Orders at the Dockside, both staged by the Abbey Theatre. His latest poetry collection, Other People's Lives, appeared from New Island in 2022.




LAND OF MILK AND HONEY: C PAM ZHANG IN CONVERSATION WITH SINÉAD CUDDIHY




