

Online Citizens Planning Portal to be launched

SDCC Planning Portal

South Dublin County Council is preparing to launch a new Citizen's Planning Portal which aims to modernise the viewing of planning applications and processing and administration of third-party submissions. This new Citizen's Planning Portal will give members of the public the option to submit observations and associated payment on all relevant planning applications online. Observations can be made within five weeks of a Planning Application being received by the Planning Authority on this system.

This Planning Portal will become active on www.sdcc.ie during the summer and will replace the current planning application search / viewer at Applications | South Dublin County Council (sdublincoco.ie).



E-Planning Project

Implementation of the new Citizen's Planning Portal is an integral step in South Dublin County Council's move to provide of a full ePlanning system.

At present, it is not possible for members of the public, developers or agents to make planning applications online to South Dublin County Council. This means that applications, including associated documents such as maps, drawings and newspaper notices must be submitted in hard copy to the Planning Department.

South Dublin County Council is currently engaging with the LGMA (Local Government Management Agency) to progress the implementation of the national online ePlanning system, through which planning applications will be submitted. Once fully rolled out, ePlanning will provide an online option for the public to engage with the planning system, in addition to the existing paper based system.

When implemented, the ePlanning system will improve efficiency in the statutory planning process and deliver on the government strategy to move more public services online. Information will be more readily available to the public, as files can be made available for viewing online more quickly than paper files. There will also be cost and environmental savings for applicants, from reduced use of paper and ink.


Council meetings to be webcast!

The Council meeting held on Monday, 11 April marked the first meeting webcast live to the public.

Anyone wishing to view a Council meeting live can log in from the Council meetings page on www.sdcc.ie and watch along. Video cameras at our Council meetings will capture the live information and send it to a central server, which in turn sends it to anyone that would like to view the meeting.

The service allows greater access to Council proceedings, and decisions and eliminates barriers that prevent some people from attending meetings. Should you miss a meeting, or would like to view a section of the meeting again, the Council microsite will contain archived Council meetings and access to any document or presentation displayed during the webcast. The archives allow you to view the meeting at your leisure and, through the use of the index points, allow you to jump to specific agenda points. Archived versions are available within 48 hours of broadcast. They remain online for twelve months. Through the webcasting of full Council meetings, we hope to promote transparency, understanding and participation in local democracy. Meetings are streamed in high definition and work on all mobile devices.





We are delighted to announce the completion of the next phase of the Dodder Greenway which takes in the section in Dodder Valley linear Park from the City Weir in Firhouse to the Cherryfield entrance at Firhouse Road and also Knocklyon Road. The works began in June 2021 and finished on time for opening to the public in April.

The Local Authority Home Loan

The Local Authority Home Loan (LAHL) is a Government backed mortgage for first time buyers or other eligible applicants through local authorities. The scheme is for the purchase of new or second-hand residential properties and for self-builds up to a maximum value of €320,000 in South Dublin. It also includes the purchase of homes through State schemes such as the Tenant Purchase and Affordable Housing Schemes. Single applicants must have an annual gross income of not more than €65,000 and joint applicants must have an annual gross income of not more than €75,000.

The "Fresh Start" principle means that people who are divorced or separated and have no interest in the family home, or who have undergone personal insolvency or bankruptcy arrangement or proceedings or other legal process, will also be eligible to apply.



Climate Action Update

Dublin's climate is changing, and this poses risks and challenges to everyone living in the region. Climatic trends facing South Dublin include more frequent extreme weather events such as prolonged dry spells, powerful storms and flooding.

To address these concerns, South Dublin County Council published our first Climate Change Action Plan in 2019. There are 130 actions across five key areas in the plan which sees the Council working on a wide variety of projects and initiatives (both long and short term) which aim to address not only own emissions but those of wider society.

Dublin Climate Action Week will take place again in 2022 from 12 to 17 September.

Climate Action Week will feature a range of interesting events which will inform and educate the citizens of South Dublin on the issues of climate change as well as showcasing Dublin's climate action progress and demonstrating the leadership role of the four local authorities and collaboration with other partners.

SuDS Householders guide

South Dublin County Council recently launched a new Householder's Guide to Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS). Benefits of SuDS for you include reducing flood risk through managing rainfall around your home, bringing nature and wildlife closer to you and providing an attractive amenity for you to enjoy.

The guide provides householders with examples of SuDS at home including water butts that collect rainfall for later use, installing your own raingarden, replacing your driveway with grass paving instead of tarmacadam, or putting a green roof on a new extension.

This all happens as SuDS manage rainfall in a way that mimics nature. SuDS also address the issues with traditional surface water drainage, helping to reduce flood risk in South Dublin.





Innovation Centre


South Dublin County Council has turned the sod on a new state of the art Innovation Centre in Tallaght, Dublin.

The Minister of State for Planning and Local Government, Peter Burke TD, joined the Council in Tallaght in March to mark the beginning of this exciting Council-led initiative.

The Innovation Centre is set to be completed in 2023 and will be a four storey 2,980msq building of significant architectural merit that provides three floors of flexible office accommodation to support start-up enterprises. The Innovation Centre can accommodate up to 60 businesses and within the building, there will be a public area on the ground floor with town hall space and a café, complete with co-working space and lettable offices in various sizes on the upper floors of the building, with the Innovation Centre fronting directly onto a new urban plaza.

A €14 million project, the development is strategically located on Council owned land in the Cookstown regeneration area of Tallaght Town Centre. The Innovation Centre is one part of a new urban district called Innovation Quarter Tallaght that is being developed by the Council that also includes a new Affordable Housing Scheme, Innovation Square, as well as the Tallaght District Heating network.

The delivery of the Innovation Centre will also compliment current investment of over €80 million in infrastructure projects underway in Tallaght, such as the delivery of



a new Heritage Centre, the completion of Tallaght Stadium bringing it to 10,000-seater capacity and a major public realm enhancement programme for Tallaght Town Centre.

The Innovation Centre will play a significant role in developing start-up enterprises and contributing to the Dublin economy, providing cutting edge facilities, a range of start-up programmes, including training, mentoring, funding supports and skills development, wherein the longer-term, this new facility will support the creation of over 700 jobs, which will be worth €80 million to the economy.

AWS Think Big Space

South Dublin County Council (SDCC), through South Dublin Libraries, launched the AWS Think Big Space in Tallaght, in collaboration with Amazon Web Services (AWS), in April.



The AWS Think Big Space is a new educational lab located beside the Tallaght Luas stop, which aims to inspire an interest in science, technology, engineering, arts and maths. It provides a dedicated space for students, educators and communities to explore innovative and imaginative ideas through interactive hands-on technical education. AWS has opened AWS Think Big Spaces across the world, however, this is the first AWS Think Big Space to launch in Europe.

South Dublin Libraries and AWS will host an innovative programme of events in the AWS Think Big Space. Events will take place every month and feature Creative Hut Robotics workshops and virtual reality (VR) workshops. The VR workshops will introduce students to the technology behind VR as well providing a hands-on experience and the chance to see VR in action. In the Creative Hut robotics workshops, students will have the opportunity to collaborate and create amazing robots, take on challenges and get an introduction to robotics technology. Students and teachers will be encouraged to "Think Big" by using their creativity and imagination as they explore the technologies on offer. The programme will support interactive hands-on learning and will be available for 4th class to 6th class primary school groups, and 1st year to 4th year secondary school groups.

Jackie Fox receives Freedom of South Dublin County

Jackie Fox, a Tallaght woman who has tirelessly campaigned against bullying has recently received the Honorary Freedom of South Dublin County.

Jackie received the award in a ceremony in County Hall, Tallaght on Friday, 6 May.

Elected members of South Dublin County Council agreed in December 2021 to honour Jackie in recognition of her campaigning for legislation to make online bullying a crime and its passage into law as 'Coco's Law' and in honour of her daughter, Nicole.

The Honorary Freedom of the County is the highest civic honour that can be bestowed upon an individual by South Dublin County Council.

It is reserved for those who have made exceptional or unique contributions to the common good or to persons who have made outstanding contributions to South Dublin County.

The Mayor of South Dublin County, Councillor Peter Kavanagh, said at the event:

"Jackie suffered the worst loss imaginable. No parent, in their worst nightmares, can imagine the heartache and emptiness that comes from losing a child. Jackie's daughter Nicole was taken from her doting mother through the vile and terrible actions of her peers.

When Nicole lost her life, Jackie was devastated. Her baby, her Coco, taken away"



He added: "Laws don't get written overnight, and Jackie had a long road to travel between 2018 and 2020. A long road of living through the heartbreak over and over to tell her story. She never wavered."

President Michael D. Higgins signed Coco's Law into effect on the 28 December 2020, and Jackie continues to visit schools across the country to raise awareness about suicide and bullying.




