

What is Social Inclusion?

Social Inclusion is “the process which ensures that those at risk of poverty and social exclusion gain the opportunities and resources necessary to participate fully in economic, social and cultural life and enjoy a standard of living and well being that is considered normal in the society in which they live”.



Who is at risk of Social Inclusion?

Ireland's updated National Action Plan for Social Inclusion 2015 – 2017 identifies seven groups as being at greater risk of social exclusion.

- Older People
- Ethnic Minorities
- Disabled People
- Women
- Children and Young People
- Travellers
- LGBTQI+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex and others)



Why Social Inclusion Festival?

The purpose of South Dublin County Social Inclusion Festival is to highlight and promote the positive work that South Dublin County Council is involved in to reduce social exclusion and poverty. It is a programme of events organised by the Social Inclusion Unit, Community Services Department to highlight the diversity and creativity

of people in South Dublin County. The Unit reaches out into all sections of the community, connecting many people and groups who are normally isolated and on the margins. It is an opportunity for people to learn new skills, share ideas and participate in their community.



Social Inclusion Unit, Housing, Social and Community Development Department

South Dublin County Council's dedicated Social Inclusion Unit endeavours to deliver on the Council's objective to take a leadership role in Social Inclusion and to create a society where everyone experiences full and equal partnership in all aspects of life.

The Social Inclusion Unit endeavours to develop a society where all citizens are recognised, accepted and maintain a sense of belonging within the County. This is achieved through collaboration with other Council Departments, agencies/groups, and through the delivery of its programmes. 2019 has been a busy year for the Unit in the delivery of several programmes which included European Action Week Against Racism, Bealtaine, Africa Day and the Traveller Culture Programme amongst others.

In addition to the above, the third intercultural food and craft festival, Flavours of South Dublin, took place on the 23rd June, where over 7,500 people were in



attendance over the course of the day. This year saw the return of the intercultural cooking demonstration kitchen with 5 different chefs. The recordings from this event were made available through the Council's social media and the South Dublin Migrant Integration Forum.

Adrienne Moloney and Donna O'Reilly are continuously developing the work of the Social Inclusion Unit and look forward to working with our partners to improve inclusivity and diversity in the County.

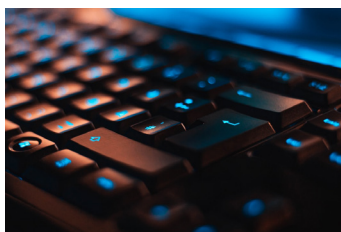

Gzhel Masterclass

Gzhel is a traditional Russian folk art, involving a style of simple blue and white painting on ceramics. It takes its name from the village of Gzhel and surrounding area, where it has been produced since 1802.

Supporting adult literacy needs in Ireland: how organisations are becoming more literacy friendly



National Adult Literacy Agency

The OECD Adult Skills Survey¹ shows that one in six Irish adults find reading and understanding everyday texts difficult: for example, reading a bus timetable or medicine instructions.



One in four (**754,000 people**) has difficulties in real world maths, from basic addition and subtraction to calculating averages.



The survey also showed that people who scored at the lowest literacy and numeracy levels often have no or low qualifications, earn less income and have poorer health.

Supporting adult literacy needs in Ireland

Many organisations are aware that their customers find some reading, writing and numbers difficult. This can result in unclear communications, misunderstandings and additional staff time and resources. For this reason many organisations are looking at how they engage with their customers who struggle with reading and understanding information and services.

Becoming more literacy friendly

South Dublin County Council (SDCC) works closely with the National Adult Literacy Agency (NALA) to provide literacy friendly services. This means SDCC takes into account the literacy needs of the public and staff in everything they do. This leads to a higher level of service overall and benefits the public, Council staff and elected representatives.

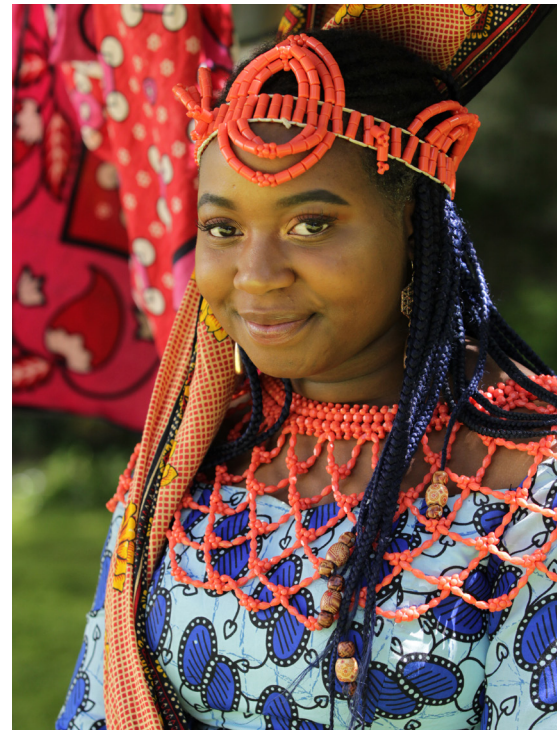

Dublin LGBTQ Pride

Dublin LGBTQ Pride Ltd (Dublin Pride) is the Irish embodiment of a global human rights movement that originated with the 1969 rights movement that followed the 1969 Stonewall riots in New York. The foundations of the organisation can be traced back to the Irish Gay Rights Movement, established in 1973. The first full Gay Pride Week took place in 1980 and featured a picnic at Merrion Square. Volunteers then worked to organise the first ever parade on 25th June 1983, which became a key aspect of the movement in Ireland and the festival we see today. It is one of the largest Pride festivals in Europe with 60,000 participating in the 2018 parade through Dublin City. The organisation also serves as a platform for the LGBT community, highlighting issues and celebrating diversity.
