Clonburris

In May, An Bord Pleanála approved South Dublin County Council's plan to deliver up to 11,000 new homes at the Clonburris Strategic Development Zone.

The land, comprising approximately 280 hectares, is located between the established communities of Lucan, Clondalkin and Liffey Valley. The lands have been designated by the Government as a Major Urban Housing Development Site and could provide homes for a population of over 21,000. The approved Planning Scheme will include the provision of three primary and three post-primary schools.

Approximately 72% of housing will be located within 500 metres of schools and about 98% of residents will be able to access a bus stop within 400 metres or train station within 800 metres, thereby significantly reducing dependence on the private car as we also address climate change. The lands will be serviced by two train stations at Kishoge and Clondalkin/Fonthill, approximately a 15-minute train journey from Dublin City Centre. Three Regional Roads, including the Outer Ring Road, connect the lands to the N4 and N7 National Routes.

South Dublin County Council is confident that Clonburris will have a central role to play in addressing the demand for new housing in Dublin.



Playspace Programme

The Council opened playspaces throughout the County with official openings taking place in Tymon Park, Lucan Demesne, Ballymount Park, Glendown Park and Grifeen Valley Park, among others.

Creating better play environments will bring benefits for the physical and mental health of the children growing up here and for communities.

Playspaces are designed to adapt to space where they are implemented and utilise the natural setting found there. They provide a space and an environment for play, rather than merely equipment for children to play with, are located where children live, with an emphasis on natural Playspaces, and focus on the type of play that is most important to early childhood development.

South Dublin County Council's Playspace Programme was also nominated for a Chambers Ireland Excellence in Local Government Award in Supporting Active Communities this year.

Local Elections 2019



Forty councillors were elected at the 2019 Local Elections in May. This includes seventeen newly elected members that joined a returning twentythree to make up the forty seats in the Council. They will act as the public representatives of the people of South Dublin County over the next five years.

Fianna Fáil was returned as the largest political party in the make-up of the new Council while 35% of the seats, 14 out of 40, were won by women, higher than the national average.

The new Council sat for the first time at the Annual Meeting of South Dublin County Council held on Friday 7 June 2019 in County Hall, Tallaght, where Cllr Vicki Casserly representing the Lucan electoral area was elected Mayor of South Dublin County.

Voter.ie

In the lead up to the Local Elections, South Dublin County Council and the other three Dublin local authorities launched a new web portal that enables over one million Dublin residents to check their electoral details in real-time.

Voter.ie is a joint initiative involving the four Dublin local authorities. It was developed to improve the efficiency and accuracy of the Register of Electors and allow for online registration.

In addition to the basic search functionality, the portal will also allow voters who are registered with mygov.id to:

- Add themselves to the Register of Electors
- Change their address or other details, including citizenship or change of name
- Remove themselves from the Register

Voter.ie is an additional service available to voters in Dublin and it does not replace the existing paper process.





Combat Period Poverty

South Dublin County Council launched a new initiative on Friday, 8 March, that provides free sanitary products in public toilets at Council offices in Tallaght and Clondalkin.

This was in response to a campaign by the Homeless Period Ireland organisation to combat 'Period Poverty' that works to support girls and women

who require sanitary products but are unable to afford them. Period poverty is when a person struggles or is unable to access sanitary products due to financial constraints.

The pilot initiative was launched in County Hall, Tallaght on International Women's Day by then-Mayor of South Dublin County Council, Cllr Mark Ward. Female sanitary products are available in the publicly accessible toilets in both County Hall, Tallaght and Clondalkin Civic Offices. Items can be taken free of charge when needed.

€1 billion investment plan for 4,500 new homes



South Dublin County Council considered housing proposals in July that could deliver up to 4,500 new homes to the area. The total investment envisaged under the ambitious housing plan is in excess of €1 billion.

The lands discussed included:

2,600 New Homes at the Clonburris SDZ Scheme

> 500 New Homes in Killinarden, Tallaght

150 New Homes at Belgard Square North

The schemes will be delivered in the coming years. It is expected that over 70% of the 4,500 homes will be delivered as either social or affordable housing. The final breakdown of the five mixed tenure developments will be decided based on the final master plans approved for each site and on the government's affordable housing scheme.

The €1 billion investment is part of the Council's plans for building new homes in South Dublin over the coming years as part of its commitment to the government's overall Rebuilding Ireland programme.

Exceeding Housing Targets

In February, figures released by the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government showed that more than 1,787 additional households were supported by South Dublin County Council through social housing solutions in 2018, representing 115% of the Council's Rebuilding Ireland target set for last year.

Under the Rebuilding Ireland Programme, annual targets are set for each local authority area. Local authorities are responsible for monitoring and delivering on these targets, including through collaboration with Approved Housing Bodies (AHBs). In 2018, 22 local authorities exceeded their overall Rebuilding Ireland targets.

Climate Change Action Plan

The Climate Change Action Plan was approved by Council in May. The plan identifies the main climate risks facing South Dublin County and includes both the Councils' and the current levels of greenhouse gas emissions across the South Dublin County Council area. It includes four targets for the Council to reach in the coming years:



- A 33% improvement in the Council's energy efficiency by 2020,
- A 40% reduction in the Councils' greenhouse gas emissions by 2030,
- To make Dublin a climateresilient region, by reducing the impacts of future climate change-related events,
- To actively engage and inform citizens on climate change.

Through the Climate Change Action Plan, South Dublin County Council has put forward 130 actions that are either ongoing or planned within the Council, under five key areas - Energy and Buildings, Transport, Flood Resilience, Nature-Based Solutions and Resource Management.

All-Ireland Pollinator Plan

The Council signed up to the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan in November after undertaking a range of projects throughout the year to assist our native pollinating insects like honeybees, bumblebees, hoverflies, and butterflies.

One of these projects involves selecting areas of our public parks and other appropriate roadside verges around the County where a plan for reduced mowing can be implemented for the benefit of biodiversity. These 'pollinator sites' can be identified by the 'Managed for Biodiversity' signage that is being erected in the chosen areas.





Public Water Fountains

In September, South Dublin County Council launched a new public water fountain located at the Civic Plaza, Tallaght, the first of nine public water fountains installed in 2019.

Public water fountains are aimed at supporting wellbeing and healthier lifestyle choices, promoting active travel options and encouraging the use of reusable flasks and bottles over single-use plastics.

Tallaght Stadium Expansion



South Dublin County Council has immediate plans to extend the seating capacity of the Council owned Tallaght Stadium to 10,000, with the building of the North Stand. The Council also plans to develop the West Stand to incorporate a high-quality corporate area. This work follows the expansion of the stadium in March of this year with the opening of the South Stand.

In conjunction with these plans, South Dublin County Council intends to promote Tallaght Stadium as an events venue to include music, festivals and all aspects of community events. With stadium seating and temporary on-field seating, the venue will accommodate up to 20,000 people.

In advance of the building of the North Stand, South Dublin County Council have contracted Core to provide an analysis of advertising and branding opportunities for Tallaght Stadium. The analysis is expected to be completed at the beginning of 2020 and will inform future advertising and marketing plans for Tallaght Stadium.

The development of Tallaght Stadium and the advertising and marketing strategy comes on the ten-year anniversary of the stadium opening in 2009 and following a very successful year.

The opening of the South Stand in March was followed with a new Tallaght Stadium attendance record being set in April for the Shamrock Rovers and Bohemians clash. Tallaght Stadium played host to the UEFA European U17 Championship in May and saw packed stands in October for both the Republic of Ireland Women's National Football Team's win over Ukraine and Stephen Kenny's U-21's side's match with Italy.






School Wardens say 'STOP! for the LOLLIPOP' as driver drive through incidents increase.

School Wardens throughout South Dublin County Council are calling for all road users to 'STOP! for the LOLLIPOP' as part of a new campaign launched by South Dublin County Council this November. Each morning, and afternoon, School Wardens across the County face many challenges in the delivery of a safe crossing service for primary children. Incident data recorded at school crossings show that, over the last five years, 29% of all recorded incidents at a school crossing is a driver, motorcyclist or cyclist failing to stop.

Not many people know that a School Warden is legally empowered to stop traffic to facilitate a safer crossing for children on the journey to and from school. So, what should you do on approach to a school crossing? All road users should be extra vigilant around schools and near school crossings by reducing their speed and being free from distraction. In accordance with the rules of the road, road users should always observe the instructions of the School Warden and remain stopped until the school warden has safely returned to their position on the footpath. Failure to stop for the School Warden carries the threat of penalty points and a fine for a motorist, and a fixed charge notice for cyclists. However, a fine and penalty points fail in comparison to the damage that can be done when a road user fails to stop at a school crossing.



As part of the campaign primary schools, serviced by School Wardens, will be sent a campaign pack consisting of a poster, key rings and a #stopforthelollipop campaign sheet to help spread the school crossing safety message throughout the wider school community.

Road Safety

"School wardens provide an excellent service in creating a safer environment to enable children to independently walk, scoot or cycle to school and fellow road users must play their part in observing the instructions of a School Warden to create safer spaces outside our schools."

South Dublin County Council employs school wardens to operate 94 crossings around the County and are employed under the Local Government Act 1955 in order to facilitate a safer crossing of the road for primary school children.

WEATHER WARNINGS

Met Éireann is the National Meteorological Service of Ireland and one of its most important roles is to issue weather forecasts and warnings for Ireland. This Public Weather Service mandate is primarily to protect life and ensure citizen safety. The service also supports the activities of the citizen and other agencies to mitigate damage to property and reduce disturbance to economic activity.

Met Éireann's main suite of warnings are issued between 10am and midday and these are updated as new information becomes available. In general, warnings will not be issued more than 48-hours ahead of the expected adverse weather but advisories on potential hazards can be issued up to a week in advance.

COLOUR CODING EXPLAINED



STATUS YELLOW Weather that does NOT pose a threat to the general population but is potentially dangerous on a localised scale. **Be Aware** about meteorological conditions and check if you are exposed to danger by nature of your activity or your specific location. Do not take any avoidable risks.



STATUS ORANGE Infrequent and dangerous weather conditions which may pose a threat to life and property. **Prepare** yourself in an appropriate way depending on location and activity. All people and property in the affected areas can be significantly impacted. **Check** your activity/event and delay or cancel as ap-propriate.

STATUS RED Rare and very dangerous weather conditions from intense meteorological phenomena. **Take action** to protect yourself and your property. Fol-low instructions and advice given by the authorities under ALL circumstances and be prepared for exceptional measures.




