Winners will receive a financial contribution in recognition of their outstanding commitment and continued efforts to deliver meaningful impact in their local communities.

CATEGORY AWARD NAME		WHO CAN APPLY?
A	Civic Pride & Community Endeavour	Community groups involved in instilling civic pride and encouraging community participation and endeavour.
B	Community Facility of the Year	Community facilities demonstrating proactive and innovative approaches in the response to meeting their local community's needs.
C	Sport & Recreation	Clubs and groups that have demonstrated a commitment to the community. Focusing in particular on the positive impact and response to wider community development needs.
D	Social Inclusion Award	Community groups that create opportunities for all to participate in local/community life.
E	Age Friendly Award	Active age groups providing support, activities and services by and for older people.
F	Gradam Cultúr agus Oidhreacht na hÉireann	Community groups working to promote the Irish language, Irish culture, local history or local heritage.
G	Environmental Award	Community groups and/or schools who are involved with, engage, deliver and promote environmental initiatives in the local community.
H	Community Health & Wellbeing	Community groups/clubs that deliver programmes/events targeted at improving Health and Wellbeing of those living in the area.
I	Young Peoples Award	Youth groups/projects providing support, activities and services by and for younger people.

Groups can only apply on their own behalf. Only one application should be made per group.

CATEGORY AWARD NAME		WHO CAN BE NOMINATED?
J	Volunteer of the Year	Community groups can nominate a volunteer who has made a significant contribution to their local community.

Groups can nominate a Volunteer for consideration for these awards.

Application Guidelines

- Categories A to I are self-nomination categories i.e. Groups entering can only apply on their own behalf. Only one application should be made per group. Select the category which you feel best fits the work of your group.
- Category J – Community groups can nominate a volunteer.
- Applicants must be located and/or have a significant operation within the administrative area of South Dublin County Council.
