Item No. 3.	Illegal dumping – household rubbish, white goods, beds and large skip bags dumped in sac.		
	Action To Be Taken	Responsibility	
	 The Litter Wardens have inspected the illegal dumping on a regular basis and as no identification was found among the rubbish, litter fines could not be issued. Cllr. Ed O'Brien requested the area be monitored for 24 hours. Litter Wardens will continue to inspect the area. Residents who forward car registration numbers of litter offenders must be prepared to act as witness in legal proceedings. Following an inspection there is nowhere suitable to mount a Rapid Deployment Camera. The camera must be protected from vandalism. 	Litter Warden	

Item No. 4.	Anti-social behaviour – teenagers at bottom of cul de sac and in the laneway.		
	Action To Be Taken	Responsibility	
	 Anti social behaviour is not in the remit of SDCC. Under the Data Protection Act, CCTV can only be used for the purpose for which it was installed. A camera mounted for illegal dumping could not be used for anti social behaviour. John McLoughlin suggested that rather than close off the laneway it could be opened up and the shrubbery removed. With the new lighting system and shrubbery removed the laneway would be brighter with no shelter for people to congregate. The area would be safer for the residents. 	John McLoughlin
