Bill Kearney has arranged an on site meeting with South Dublin County Council's Conservation Officer on Wednesday 5th October 2011 @ 11.30am, to discuss various options for the old mill site. 2. Community Groups should report incidents of dumping to South Dublin County Council. The Litter Warden will be informed and after investigation, if evidence is found, fines and direct prosecutions will be issued. 3. David Fennell will see if a Community Grant is available for a Kilcronan Community Garden name stone. In order to address the problem of overgrowing weeds around the electrical pylon, David will contact the ESB and proceed with an appropriate weed application. 4. Joan Rafferty will forward a list to Donna Lakes of areas that the Council may be able to maintain or clean. Environmental Services will then examine these areas to see what work can be undertaken. 	<p>2a and 2b addressed with No. 1 above.</p> <p>South Dublin County Council sold the waste collection service and the bins to Greyhound. Waste presentation bye-laws are now being implemented and the householder that the bin was registered under is responsible for the bin. The black and the brown bins are chipped and can be traced back to the householder, therefore if the bin is no longer in use, the householder should contact Greyhound to cancel the service and request removal of the bin. Only empty bins that are no longer used will be removed.</p>
