Role of the Resident Representative

Resident Representatives will:

- Represent the views and interests of residents and Resident Associations from across South Dublin County
- Help identify community safety priorities and emerging issues in their local area
- Work collaboratively with statutory agencies, community groups, and other partners
- Contribute to the development and delivery of a Local Community Safety Plan
- Attend LCSP meetings and related workshops or engagement events

This is a voluntary role. Support and information will be provided to all Resident Representatives to help them participate fully and confidentially.

Who can apply?

Resident associations based in South Dublin County Council's administrative area are invited to submit an Expression of Interest nominating a resident representative who:

- Lives in South Dublin County Council's administrative area
- Is actively involved in their Resident Association
- Is committed to promoting inclusion, respect, and collaboration
