



We offer an attractive salary that increases each year (public sector pay scales), a public sector pension, fully funded training, credit union, bike scheme, tax-saver commuter tickets, free on-site parking, a subsidised canteen, and discounts at local gyms and shops.



Work/life balance

Supporting your life/work balance

We have many ways for you to fit work around your life. We offer flexible working where you can start and finish earlier or later, and blended working to help you balance time in the office with time at home. Time off is important, so we provide up to 30 days annual leave and generous sick pay, plus maternity leave, parent leave, adoptive leave and carers leave. SDCC also has an on-site creche.

Career progression and learning

Grow with us

Our work is varied, which gives you lots of choice in terms of roles, service areas and career progression. From planning, administation, financial, engineering and technical roles, to opportunities for school leavers, graduates or returning to work after a break, you can take your career in whatever direction you choose. Together with in-house training, coaching and mentoring, we encourage continuous learning and offer up to 100% funding with study and exam leave. We can also pay your professional membership fees if they're essential to your role. And your efforts will be recognised – we're proud to be CPD-accredited by Engineers Ireland.

Wellbeing and health

Support through life's ups and downs

We support our people with many free services. These include flu vaccinations, health checks every two years and help with stopping smoking. Our employee assistance service is available 24/7 and includes up to 6 free, confidential counselling sessions for staff and their family each year, together with a digital resource of articles, courses, workouts, recipes and more. And our Wellbeing Champions support events including health seminars, yoga, and chair massage, and can signpost you towards other wellbeing services.



Equity, diversity and inclusion initiatives and social clubs

For your social circle

We offer many ways for you to connect with people across the council. From groups like our LGBTQ+ Staff Network to informal social groups like our Golf Society. Our Sports & Social Club offers activities like parties and overseas trips, and our Social Club room can be used for pool, table tennis, darts and small exercise classes. From the day you start, we have a buddy system to support you during your induction and onboarding.

We take an employee first approach to supporting you through life's ups and downs. From paid time off when you start a family or need to care for others, our on-site creche, and bereavement leave when needed, to work-sharing and the opportunity for a shorter working year. We also provide support towards retirement.



Work environment

For wherever you work: our office, outdoors or at home

We want all our people to feel safe and comfortable - whether your work brings you indoors or takes you outside. Our HQ is in the heart of Tallaght, right by the LUAS, public transport, cycleways, the cultural quarter and The Square. It has a coffee dock, canteen and a foyer with comfy seating and break areas. We also have accessible showers, a drying room for wet clothes, hybrid meeting tech, and sit-stand desks. If you're working outdoors, we provide showers, a drying room and a canteen in each depot, together with safe places for your personal belongings.

Work that makes an impact

We work closely with people and businesses in South Dublin County to understand their needs and create initiatives that transform lives.

We've led the way in Ireland with first-oftheir-kind projects and programmes, and our work has been recognised with awards. See how people like you are making a difference in our community.



Creating a first-of-its-kind heating scheme

Our innovative team created Ireland's first-of-itskind district heating scheme. The Tallaght District Heating Project provides efficient, low-carbon heating to a number of public buildings by reusing waste heat from a data centre. The scheme reduces carbon emissions by 1,500 tonnes each year and was awarded the prestigious Energy Globe Award.

Building safe spaces for teenagers

We've created a number of hangout spaces that younger members of our community can call their own. Informed by what teenagers told us they need, our Teenspace Programme helps support young people's physical and mental health by giving them dynamic spaces where they can get outdoors, meet with friends and be more active.

Rewilding our community spaces

Together with volunteers from our community, we've been planting mini woodlands - rewilding our urban spaces with small, rapid-growing plantations of entirely native species. These 'stepping stone forests' help wildlife move from one area to another, encourage genetic diversity and provide a natural refuge in urban areas. So far we've created 39 mini woodlands, with 35,000 trees planted by 1,500 volunteers.

People-powered budgeting

Our Participatory Budgeting Initiative asks residents to develop ideas for their local area, which they then vote on based on the real needs of the area. We deliver the winning ideas, so they can bring them to life. Community initiatives include building a new playground in Waterstown Park, planting native apple trees throughout Clondalkin and launching a heritage trail app. We were the first local authority in Ireland to run this type of funding initiative, and it's won a Chambers Ireland Local Government Award in Citizen Engagement and been shortlisted for a European Innovation in Politics award in the 'Democracy' category.

Creating an innovative new urban quarter

Unique in Ireland, the City Edge Project is a transformative initiative to create a new liveable, sustainable and climate-resilient urban quarter at the western edge of Dublin City. Working together with Dublin City Council, the project will transform 700 hectares within the Naas Road, Ballymount and Park West areas to create 40,000 new homes and 75,000 jobs. It has the potential to contribute €13bn GVA a year to the economy, making it one of the largest regeneration projects in Europe.

Creating a place for business to grow

Our purpose-built Innovation Centre (Work IQ) provides flexible office and coworking space for up to 60 businesses, together with contributing to the Dublin economy with programmes including training, mentoring, funding and skills development. The centre will support the creation of 700+ jobs, worth €80m to the economy and was shortlisted for LAMA Award 2025 (Best Enterprise and Startup Hub). It's part of our wider Innovation Quarter Tallaght project, which includes a new Affordable Housing Scheme, Tallaght District Heating Network and Innovation Square.


Setting new standards in place-making

Clonburris, Dublin's newest community, is setting a bold new standard for sustainable urban living. Thoughtfully designed across 280 hectares of canalside parkland, this vibrant, eco-friendly neighbourhood is being developed in collaboration with major landowners and supported by Government investment through the Urban Regeneration Development Fund.

With 11,000 new affordable homes planned for over 23,000 residents, it stands as the largest residential project of its kind in Europe. Recently honoured with the LAMA National Impact Award, Clonburris is a transformative vision and a progressive model for communities.
