South Dublin County Council is strongly committed to facilitating disabled people to achieve equality of opportunity to access, and participate in, the social, economic, environmental and cultural life of South Dublin County. Some interesting recent developments in your County include:

Jobot's Access All Areas - **Access Guide Videos** are a series of 4 videos detailing the range of access that we provide across our facilities and services. They are available from http://accessible.southdublin.ie in multiple formats such as accessible text documents, mp3 audio and with optional closed captions.

There are over 100 accessible parking spaces provided for disabled drivers/passengers at South Dublin County Council owned buildings and facilities, and on-street in villages across the County. A Smartphone app showing the location of accessible parking spaces across the entire greater Dublin region is available as a free download for both iPhone and Android from http://accessible.southdublin.ie

Access for People with hearing loss: The Council Chamber in County Hall, the Area Committee Room in Clondalkin Civic Offices and most of our customer care and library counters are fitted with hearing induction loops. We also use the Irish Remote Interpreting Service.

Accessible Recreation and Leisure: The range of access available in the Camac Valley Caravan and Camping Park, and the accessible toilet facilities in the nearby Corkagh Park Fishery, Playground and Pet Farm has been extensively improved. Tallaght and Clondalkin Leisure Centres, RUA Red County Arts Centre, Tallaght Civic Theatre, and Tallaght Stadium also offer significant levels of accessibility.

Accessible glass recycling facilities are available in Sean Walsh Park, Tallaght.

South Dublin County Council has a Disability Liaison / Access & Equality Officer, who is available to help you with any queries you might have, or assistance you may require, in relation to the accessibility of information and services provided by the Council.
