#### **November Jobs To Do**

- Safe guard your stored crop by removing signs of decay to prevent rot setting in and possibly spreading.
- Raise containers to aid water drainage and to keep off frozen surface.
- Protect plants by use of mulch, fleece & cloches.

### **Winter Composting**

Keep your compost active over winter by keeping it insulated and added to with "green & brown" materials.

The green being kitchen leftovers and the brown being fallen dry leaves for example.

Keep your compost pile well aerated, largely moisure free & balanced well, (more brown than green).

You could be forgiven for thinking that the Mill Lane site with it's sheltered perimieter and quite surroundings is in the heart of the country and not infact minutes from an overhead M50 and the course of the River Liffey. A peacock made an appearance there recently.



Wildlife is attracted to allotment sites, foxes in particular can be attracted to bonemeal added to your soil, they will dig and dig, they are helpful as they will kill vermin too. Have you come accross any wild visitors while on site? The Dublin mountains have deer roaming around and one was seen at Friarstown previously. Of course a sheep or two were known to have put in an appearance also.



Remember to always keep dogs under control & on a lead within your own allotment and not let them become the "wildlife".

### <u>Soil</u>

Do you have acidic or alkaline soil? Blueberries and potatoes for example like acidic soil whereas broccolli and cabbages grow best in alkaline soil.



You can purchase a soil pH test for a modest cost. It is best to match your crops to the soil for optimal results. Of course, you can affect the pH by use of additives.
