

Update on the Slí Mór from Dublin City to Timahoe





The Joe Williams Archive is delighted to welcome Dr Seamus Cullen as our lecturer this year. Dr Cullen is a renowned historian whose excellent work is well known to anyone interested in Irish local and general history (see his personal website https://www.seamuscullen.net/ for further information).

Established in pre-Christian times, the Slí Mór was one of the five main roads of Ireland. It enabled trade, commerce, social communications and religious practices to be achieved at a time when travel involved much more effort – and less comfort - than it does today.

Come and hear how a precious length of the original Slí Mór still exists in Clondalkin village (almost in its original state) and its importance to the existence of Clondalkin and other villages which grew up along the route. Find out why the Slí Mór became established along this route and what new information scholars have uncovered about one of our earliest Irish roadways.






We are delighted to have poet and critic, Rosamund Taylor, visit our book club to discuss her first collection, In Her Jaws, published by Banshee Press in May 2022.

Rosamund Taylor dares us across thresholds and invites us to glimpse the world as we've never seen it before. She boldly charts a journey of survival and transformation with poems on history reimagined, astronomy, sorcery, wild landscapes, talismanic creatures, and queer love. Rosamund explores what it means to live in a female body that is not defined by lack, or want, or perpetual suffering, but is possessed by a real and defined sense of erotic autonomy. These poems burn from the inside out with possibility, and there is magic, mystery and reclamation at every turn. *In Her Jaws* is a landmark debut that extends and deepens the Irish tradition of writing the female perspective, while also breaking new ground.

Rosamund's work has been broadcast on RTE radio's The Poetry Programme and on BBC Radio 4's Poetry Please. She has published over fifty poems in Ireland, Canada, the US and the UK.




Irish History Live: 1916 and the War of Independence


