This exhibition celebrates the work of local photographer Gerry O'Shea who, along with his wife Kitty, ran Rosemount Art Studio at their family home on Anne Devlin Avenue between 1968 to 1972. Occasionally Gerry was requested to shoot fashion shows by the late Charlie Nicholl who ran a lady's fashion boutique called Tanya Boutique in Rathfarnham. This exhibition documents a selection of images from the period and should be of interest to locals and nonlocals alike.

Tallaght Motor Races 1935-48 August at Castletymon Library
